

## Checklist for Registering Classic (Modified) Vehicles

### Classic (Modified) Vehicles

- These are vehicles that are modified from standard manufacture, that are outside the “Acceptable Standards set out by the RMS”.
- The vehicle must be 30 years or older.
- The vehicle must not exceed GVM 3.5 tonne.
- The applicant must resident in NSW and the vehicle must be garaged in NSW.
- The applicant needs to be a financial member of an approved car club.
- A blue slip must be obtained for initial application for CVS, regardless if vehicle is registered or not. Subsequent renewals require just a pink slip. Note: If the vehicle has extensive modifications it must fit within the RMS guidelines of VS1-6 or have an engineer’s certificate provided.

### To register the vehicle

- Commence at least **4 weeks** prior to due date to process all the paperwork
- When registering the vehicle for the **first time** under this scheme, a blue slip must be obtained from an approved provider, even if it is presently registered.
- **When renewing the registration**, a pink slip needs to be obtained from an approved provider.
- The applicant needs to fill out the left-hand side of the Classic Vehicle Declaration form, Parts 1 and 2.
- The safety inspection number (located on the blue or pink slip) needs to be placed in part 3 along with the date that the inspection was carried out.
- The vehicle needs to be presented to the nominated club Plate Registrar for viewing, to confirm the vehicle fits the criteria for Classic Registration and assist to fill the forms out correctly. Photos of the vehicle will be taken at this time by the Plate Registrar - front, rear and engine bay for filing.
- The nominated club Plate Registrar will fill affix our club stamp in the box in the bottom right-hand corner as the Primary Club and write, “Affiliated club number 105 with ANSMA”.
- The member will then complete and sign the “Club Member Vehicle Declaration Form” declaring the information stated on the form is true and correct and will leave with the Plate Registrar for filing purposes.
- The applicant will then mail the Classic Vehicle Declaration Form, registration papers, pink or blue slip along with your \$30 administration fee via (cheque or money order) made out to ACMA, alternatively you can EFT funds to, Commonwealth Bank, BSB 062-452, A/C 10429978, A/C Name - APMC NSW Ltd. Please ensure that your EFT payment is adequately identified by your surname and club name. Email proof of payment to CVS@APMC.asn.au
- Then post all documents to - APMC Pty Ltd, PO Box 419, Bexley NSW 2207.
- The Approved person within APMC will process the registration and fill out the right-hand side of the Classic Vehicle Declaration Form and affix his stamp in the approved Organisation area and return to you via express post.
- When you get the paperwork back from APMC, proceed to the RMS for processing with the 4-page “Application for Conditional Registration Form” available from the RMS.
- When the applicant receives the new number plate, please advise the Club Registrar for our records, (new registrations only).
